# **Google Tour Builder**

#### What is it?

Google Tour Builder is a web-based Google Earth related tool that allows you to quickly create "tours" that include globe markers, images/videos, dates, and other information.

## **Highlights**

- Great way to introduce a topic that has some geographical tie in, such as where a character in a book has gone, historical events, Earth's features, and much more.
- Work on PC and Mac and requires a Google Earth Plugin (Google Earth does not need to be installed).
- Requires a Google Account to create tours, but not to view them.
- Tours can be set to private

## **Padlet**

www.padlet.com

#### What is it?

Fast, easy way to allow students to collaborate. Free.

#### Highlights:

- Teacher creates board, students create posts
- Can be used on multiple platforms
- Posts can include multimedia: text, video, images, and links
- Notes are limited to 150 characters
- Choose from several layouts (freeform or stream)
- Sign up is not required, but editing of board settings are unavailable after 24 hours without signing in. (Teachers only)

### **COMICS**

Comics are a fun way for students to show their learning. Topics may include vocabulary practice, sequencing, retelling or changing the ending of a story, explaining a concept. Students should be encouraged to storyboard their comic before creating it.

#### **ToonDoo**

#### Highlights:

- Free, but requires sign up. Recommend a shared teacher-created account for the class.
- Can purchase a "Class" license so each student has an account.
- Has multiple layouts, backgrounds, characters.
  Students can upload their own images.
- ToonDoos can be compiled (by teacher) into a ToonBook.

#### Make Beliefs Comix

### Highlights:

- Free
- Multi-lingual options
- No registration option work must be completed in one sitting. Can be printed or emailed (requires a send from and to address recommend using teacher email for both)
- Fewer options than ToonDoo, so may be better for younger students.



# **Google Docs**

#### What is it?

A web-based suite of productivity tools to include word processing (Docs), presentations (Slides), spreadsheets (Sheets), surveys (Forms), and graphical representations (Drawings). All are available for free with a Google Account.

## Highlights:

- Files can be created and edited on most web-based devices (viewed on all).
- Files can be shared to allow others to collaborate on the same document from anywhere. All changes are viewed in real-time.
- A revision history allows you to view past versions of the same documents.
- Documents can be shared with specific people who also have a Google Account or can be set with a larger visibility to allow those without accounts the chance to view or edit.
- Files can be organized into folders which can also be shared.
- When sharing publicly, direct links or shortened URLS are recommended for easier access.

#### Socrative

#### What is it?

Socrative is a web-based student response system that allows teachers to engage their classrooms through a series of educational exercises and games via smartphones, laptops, and tablets.

#### Highlights

- Free teacher account required no separate student accounts needed. Students access via "classroom code"
- Up to 50 students in a class at once
- Uses include: polls, quizzes (which may be shared between teachers), entrance/exit slips, short answer response
- Share information online or through a portable device
- Save time grading through the automatic grading and report system
- There is a new version, "Socrative 2.0" that has a slightly easier to use interface. It is still in beta, but will eventually become the main version.

## Quizlet

#### What is it?

Quizlet is a free website providing learning tools for students, including flashcards, study & game modes.

#### **Highlights**

- Requires sign-up, but you can use your Google Account for faster access.
- Free version allows you to create and copy sets that can include terms, definitions, images (from stock images), pronunciation (from stock audio)
- Subscription adds uploading your own images and voice recordings, ad-free viewing, and tracking of class progress.
- Flashcards
- Learn -Track correct/incorrect answers and retest
- Speller -Type what you hear
- Test Randomly generated tests based on set.
- Scatter Race against the clock to drag and match terms/definitions.
- Space Race Type in the answer as terms/definitions scroll across the screen.



## **JeopardyLabs**

#### What is it?

JeopardyLabs allows you to create a customized jeopardy template without PowerPoint. The games you make can be played online from anywhere in the world.

#### Highlights:

• Free, no sign-up option. (Make sure you record the URL and password for your game so you can return to it easily.



# Management

#### Edmodo

#### What is it?

Free, secure social network for classroom use and teacher professional development.

#### **Highlights:**

- Teacher creates an account and a class (Group).
- Students join the group with a code (no email address required)
- Can be read-only or students can contribute
- Create posts, quizzes, polls, folders to organize resources, embed files

## **Classtools**

#### What is it?

A free collection of virtual classroom management tools. It also has many templates that mimic other familiar tools.

#### Highlights:

- Random Name Picker (spinner or fruit picker)
- Timer/Stopwatch
- Fakebook
- SMS (fake texts between characters)
- Common graphic organizers

## Symbaloo

#### What is it?

Symbaloo is a visual bookmarking and sharing tool. Teachers can create a webmix, which is a grid of resources that the teacher has collected (or copied from other existing webmixes). It is an easy way to collect and share a specific set of websites with students.

#### Highlights:

- Free, requires sign up.
- Create a webmix (board) for the whole year or for various units.
- Use one of the browser extensions to make adding items to a board even easier.
- SymbalooEDU accounts come with preset educational webmixes preinstalled that are continuously updated with the latest and greatest educational sites recommended by the Symbaloo Certified educators.



#### **URL Shorteners**

### What are they?

Turn longer web addresses (URLs) into short, easy to type or remember ones. This makes it easy to share a web address in print, or to have younger students type in something shorter.

## **Tinyurl**

## **Highlights:**

- Random or customized URLs
- Free and available worldwide (so some custom URLs may already be taken)
- No login, so it does not keep track of the URLs you've created (make sure you record them somewhere)

## Goo.gl

http://goo.gl

#### **Highlights**

- Free from Google No login required
- If you login with your Google Account, you can keep track of the URLs you've created as well as usage data.
- Random shortened URLs only, no customization
- URLS are case sensitive
- Also creates a QR code
